The Guardbridge Community Development Trust is a company limited by guarantee which was set up in December 2017 as a registered charity. It is looking to use the funding pledged by the University of St Andrews over the next 8 years to improve the environment of the village. The Trust is looking forward to working with all parties who have an interest in the village. At present we have 6 directors and 41 members. Our first small success, as seen above, is the placing of two extra benches in the fenced-off play area in the Motray park. These will be a useful addition for parents and grandparents to sit and watch their offspring play.

Our main objective, though, is to establish a community centre for all social activities in the village, a place which will act as meeting point for residents and therefore help to promote community interaction and social inclusion. To this end we are in the process of submitting an application for a

land asset transfer under the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015 which is under

consideration by Fife Council's Community Asset Transfer Team.



Other projects that are ongoing include the **moving of the David Finlay Memorial Stone,** again in the play park, along to the present War Memorial in the Eden Nature Reserve park. The 71st Engineer Regiment based at Leuchars have agreed to assist with this and, with the consent of the community and the family of David Finlay, we hope to achieve this in early October – in time for the

centenary celebrations of the end of World War One.
